

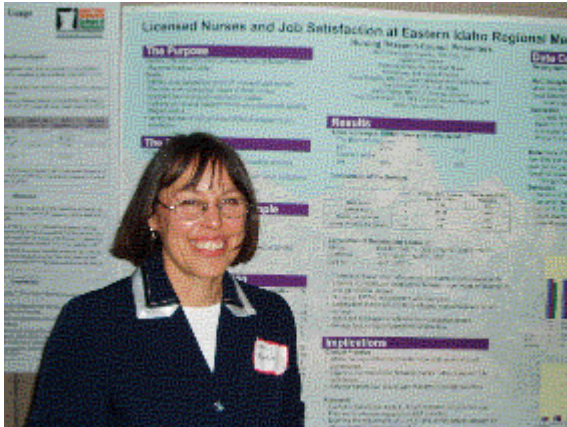

This is to reflect my responsibilities on the Nursing Research Council. The photo is of me representing our research on "Nurse's Job Satisfaction at Eastern Idaho Regional Medical Center" at Research Day at Idaho State University last spring. We did a poster presentation there.

I am now spending more time helping nurses do research in our hospital. I help with literature searches, but I also do data analysis and survey designs. I used SurveyMonkey to establish a baseline of how nurses perceive the nursing electronic record. Some of our IT staff and nurses are updating the nursing documentation screens. After the roll-out and a period of use, we will be repeating the survey to see if the changes have improved the electronic record for staff nurses. The library plays a huge role in supporting evidence-based practice not only with literature but with data showing effectiveness.

Catherine Poppino and Pam Spickelmier have begun to review and revise policies with the goal of standardizing those policies as much as possible. The two libraries have been designated as system resources which will have implications for our budgeting processes (hopefully simplifying).

The SoftLink OPAC now reflects the majority of holdings of the Magic Valley, Meridian and Boise collections. Amy Claybaugh has been very busy linking electronic content in the SoftLink

Soon, both the Magic Valley and Wood River facilities will be joining St. Luke's Boise and Meridian in a centralized circulation process for library materials.

## *A bit of IHIA history:*

In 1974 the name IHIA was adopted with the motion to change the name from Idaho Association of Health Information Librarians to Idaho Health Information Association at the March 22<sup>nd</sup> meeting in Twin Falls Idaho.

Members asked for periodicals holdings from the libraries identified in the group's survey of hospitals. The goal was to develop a union list of journals for resource sharing.

Training for new librarians and those establishing a library was offered by encouraging phone calls and visits to established libraries.

It was suggested a MEDLINE session be held at the Fall Idaho Hospital Association meeting, a permanent home for Medline by July 1, 1974 was set as a goal.

## NO PUBMED UI? NO PROBLEM!

I find it easy to order articles on DOCLINE using the PubMed UI. But what happens when the item I need is not cited in PubMed? I don't give up, but I do have to take additional steps. I had this request from the Director of Women & Children's Services. "I would like a copy of the article below when you have time. Thanks"

### **Jan '08 Neoreviews: Adverse medical events in the NICU.**

I try citation matcher in PubMed, but there are not any matches to date & title.

Next I go to LOCATORPLUS to see if there is a NLM ID for this title. I search for Journal Title in the search section and find this information:

I try the electronic link to see if I can get the article. I can only pull up the abstract but it provides the full citation including author and page number. [NeoReviews](#) Vol.9 No.1 2008 e8 © 2008 [American Academy of Pediatrics](#) Adverse Medical Events in the NICU Epidemiology and Prevention. Frank H. Morriss, Jr, MD, MPH

I print the abstract for my patron. I will need to order the electronic article from the American Academy of Pediatrics. I check DOCLINE under institutions and they have the code **ILUAAP**. Now I am ready to make my DOCLINE request. Instead of inserting the PubMed UI, I enter the NLM ID at the bottom of the page.

The title is then entered automatically into DOCLINE for me. I just have to enter the rest of the information on the article I want and route it to ILUAAP

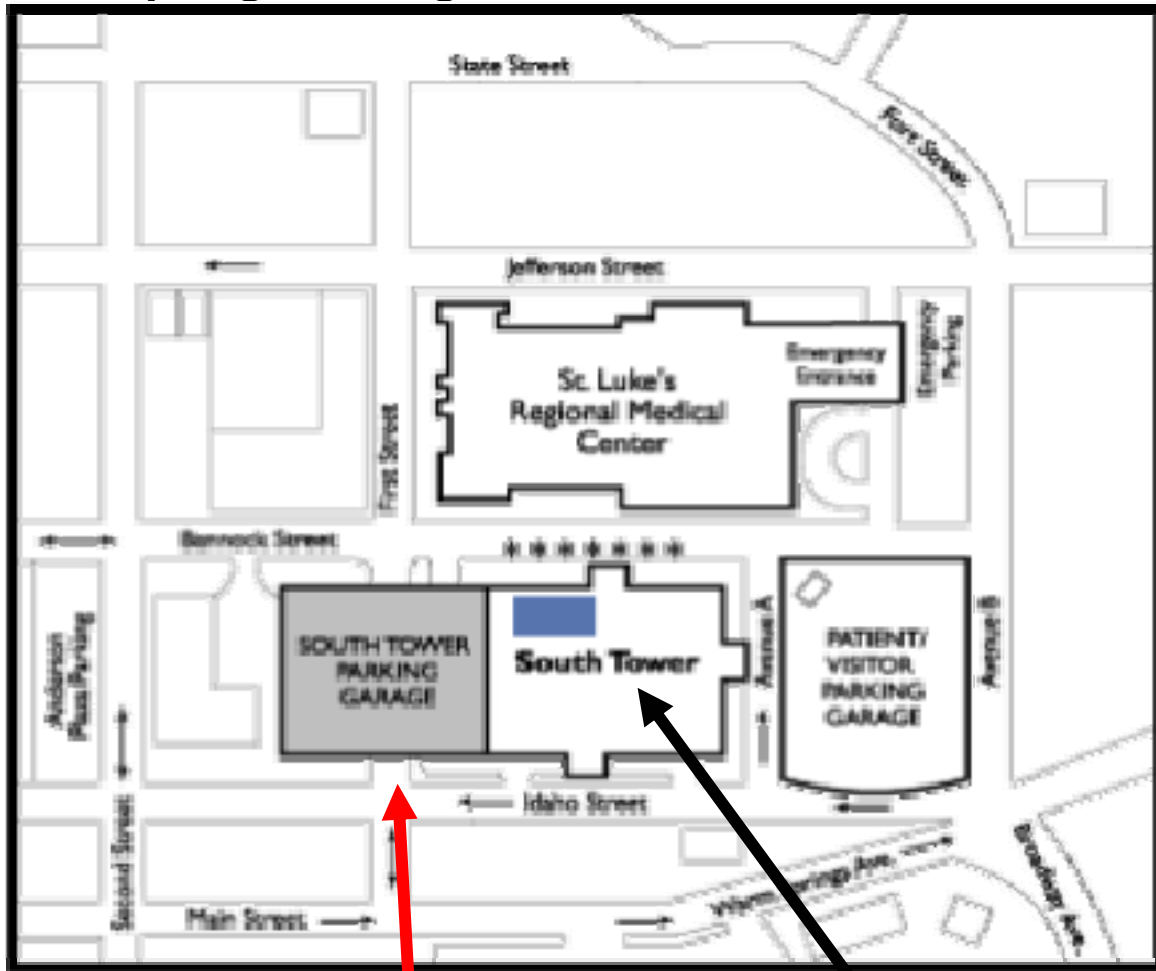
